

## 2021-2022 OHS Summer School Course Offerings

### **Summer School Credit Recovery (Seated)**

This is an in-person class that is for the sole purpose of making up lost credits due to failure of core classes or lack of credits for graduation. The course is completed individually through online GradPoint.

The classes that can be recovered are as follows: English, Science, History, Math, and Health. Other considerations may be made for students severely behind in electives at the discretion of the appropriate counselor and/or administrator.

### **Online & Seated Course Offerings**

**\* All courses are ½ Credit**

### **English**

#### **English I (½ English Credit) Seated HSS1000**

This course is designed to help students regain a half credit of **failed** English I. English I is designed to extend the student's English education in the following areas: composition, including proofreading and editing; research; vocabulary; literary analysis; test-taking skills; speaking and listening. The class is an excellent opportunity for students to polish communication skills needed for the Twenty-first Century.

#### **English II (½ English Credit) Seated HSS1011**

This course is designed to help students regain a half credit of **failed** English II. English II is designed to extend the student's English education in the following areas: composition, including proofreading and editing; research; vocabulary; literary analysis; test-taking skills; speaking and listening. The class is an excellent opportunity for students to polish communication skills needed for the Twenty-first Century.

#### **Creative Writing (½ English Credit) Online HSS0105V**

This course is a study of creative writing such as short stories, poetry, and nonfiction. The course will focus on a topic of composition including, but not limited to, sound, imagery, voice, and style. Students will study mentor texts, compose, revise, and self-reflect during the semester. Writing assignments will be aimed at encouraging creative thinking and peer feedback. Students will read essays, stories, and poetry by well-known authors to develop a writing style and enrich the creative writing process. The course will culminate in a major writing piece with a final multimedia project, as well as an online publication. Through the study of creative writing, students should complete this course with techniques of composition that can be used in various forms of writing.

This class is an elective English course for students who want to practice and hone creative writing skills. As a result of studying various forms of creative writing, composing, editing, and publishing work, student writing should improve. In addition, appreciation of creative writing as a literary form will also be gained.

Each class will require reading assignments, published blog entries, completed writing responses, peer reflection, and self-reflection. Smaller writing pieces will build toward the end of unit major writing pieces/projects.

#### **Decades 1 (½ English Credit) (Grades 10-12) Online HSS0121V**

In this humanities course, you will study various pieces of non-fiction writing and/or literature from four decades in the twentieth century (1920-1950). Since literature (or any art) is often a reflection of it's time, we will study how the writing and literature is a reflection of or a commentary on some of the cultural, political, and social events of the time. In addition, the course will touch on the science, music, fashion, entertainment, food, and fads popular during the era being studied.

*Note: This course corresponds with Decades II, which focuses on 1960-1990. The courses do not have to be taken in order.*

**Word Study (½ Credit English Elective) Online HSS0107V**

Word Study is a vocabulary building class in which students learn definitions and usage of prefixes, suffixes and root words primarily with Greek and Latin emphases. Vocabulary building exercises and review tests are administered; a great deal of memorization is required. Self-motivation required.

## **Social Studies**

**Psychology (½ Credit Social Studies Elective) Online HSS0704V**

This course introduces students to the scientific study of behavior and mental processes of humans and other animals. Topics that may be explored include research methods, biological basis of behavior, psychological disorders and their treatments, sensation and perception, memory, thinking, language, learning, intelligence, motivations, emotion, personality, human development, and social psychology.

**American History (½ Credit American History)- Seated only HSS7001**

This course is designed to help students regain a half credit of **failed** American History. This course will continue to assess the progress, the accomplishments, and the challenges facing the United States from the Civil War through World War II. Students will cover the political, social, and economic developments including westward expansion, migrations, and growth of industry, and analyze wars of the 20th century.

**Intro. to American Government (½ Credit American Govt.) Seated only HSS7008**

This course is designed to help students regain a half credit of **failed** Intro to American Government. This course takes an interesting look at the foundation of the federal, state, and local government and the transitions that have taken place up to the current time. The course discusses the rights of Americans and how the government works for the citizens. In addition, civic duty and responsibility are key components in this course. This course includes an EOC exam, along with the state-required US and Missouri Constitution exams.

## **Math**

**Algebra I (½ Math Credit)- Seated only HSS3013**

This course is designed to help students to regain a half credit of **failed** Algebra I. Algebra students will develop skills in equations, graphing, polynomials, exponents, and inequalities within the real number system.

**Geometry (½ Math Credit)- Seated only HSS3006**

This course is designed to help students regain a half credit of **failed** Geometry. Students will have an opportunity to develop logical thinking and exploration of topics connecting algebra and geometry. Students will apply inductive and deductive reasoning to undefined terms, definitions, postulates, and theorems to reach conclusions about geometric figures.

**Trigonometry (½ Math Credit) - Seated HSS0301 or Online HSS0303V**

*Prerequisite: Successful completion of Algebra II (B or better is recommended)*

This course provides an opportunity for students to expand their knowledge of mathematics and explore applications of various math concepts. Students will develop skills using trigonometric ratios, solving trigonometric equations, proving trigonometric identities, and graphing trigonometric functions.

## Science

### **Botany / Plant Science (½ Science Credit) - Seated only HSS6011**

This course provides an introduction to the classification, relationships, structure, function of plants and soil. There is an emphasis on the ecological relationships of plants between soil, animals, and humans. Topics include reproduction and development of seed and non-seed plants, and levels of organization (taxonomy). This class also is designed to bring the abstract concepts of science into practical and applicable context. There are many opportunities for hands-on learning and field study. Students will learn how to apply the concepts of this class to healthy life-long hobbies and careers.

### **Zoology (½ Science Credit) Online HSS0609V**

*Prerequisite: Biology*

This course is the study of the animal kingdom, focusing on the major groups of invertebrates and vertebrates. Topics include the classification of major phyla and the anatomy and physiology of organisms from each phylum.

### **Physical Science (½ Science Credit)- Seated only HSS6001**

This course is designed to help students regain a half credit of **failed** Physical Science. This is an exciting class that will give you a foundation in physics and chemistry with lab work and many hands-on activities. This class is offered at the freshman level and is a good foundational science class. This course is offered 1st block only.

## Additional Required Courses

### **Personal Finance (Required ½ Personal Finance Credit) (Grades 11-12) Online HSS0505V**

This course will provide students with practical life skills needed daily. With online resources such as Everfi Financial Literacy and Dave Ramsey's Foundations U, students will gain an understanding which will set them up to be successful in their future. Throughout this course students will get a further understanding of the following topics: income and taxes, checking and savings accounts, using credit wisely, managing money, investing, purchasing insurance, housing, buying cars, and more. Through this course, students gain a basic understanding of finance and are more confident and competent in making financial decisions when out on their own. **This course may be taken with permission to recover up to half a credit of Personal Finance.**

### **Fitness (½ PE or Elective Credit) Online HSS0412V**

Students in this class will learn and gain an understanding of the need for lifetime physical fitness. Students will participate in group and individual activities to gain knowledge on how to develop all areas of health-related fitness. Students will need access to the internet, a computer and be able to videotape. This class will encompass learning a variety of ways to workout. Students will record workouts, log data, and create and design their own workouts.

### **Career Opportunities II (Required ½ Career Opportunities or Elective Credit) (Grades 10-12)**

#### **Online HSS0712V**

This course will help students become college and career-ready. Students will use the Naviance system to explore their interests and abilities and identify and study careers that may fit with those interests and abilities. Students will explore educational opportunities related to these careers, and will learn the college application process. Interviewing and soft skills for the workplace will also be emphasized.

## **Health (Required ½ PE credit) Online HSS0400V**

The health curriculum focuses on the mental, physical, social and emotional areas of health. These health areas and current health issues are studied to help students make responsible decisions toward their overall wellness.

## **Electives**

### **ACT Prep (½ Elective Credit) Online HSS0714V**

*Prerequisite: recommended to have taken Algebra II or Concepts of Algebra II.*

The purpose of the ACT Prep component of this class is to prepare students for the ACT Test. As future college students striving for college admission, the ACT score can be a very important element to the admissions process. The course will allow students to prepare in a structured instructional environment for their best possible test performance.

### **Music Appreciation (½ Fine Arts Credit) Online HSS0225v**

Music Appreciation explores the many facets of musical development both in U.S. culture and world culture. Students will work from a book, take notes, and participate in listening activities.

### **Art Foundations (½ Fine Arts Credit) (Grades 9-12) Online HSS2012V**

Students will explore the basic principles and elements of art as they relate to painting, drawing, sculpture, graphic design, and printmaking through the use of vocabulary, history, and conceptual projects.

### **Art Through History (½ Fine Arts Credit) (Grades 10-12) Online HSS2001v**

This introductory course fulfills a ½ fine art credit for graduation without the expectation of creating art projects. Art Through History is a textbook survey of art styles, art concepts, and influences on Western Culture, and how they relate to people. A visually rich environment is presented to the student in this class, preparing him or her for making informal and enlightening observations of the world around us. This is a text, note, and test formatted class with no art projects.

### **Drawing I (1/2 Credit, Gr. 10-12) Seated HSS0202 or Online HSS0202V**

*Prerequisite- Full year of Art Foundations*

Students will explore a diversity of styles in order to draw his/her interpretation of the subject matter. He or she will also use a variety of materials and approaches in order to solve the problem of drawing forms on a two dimensional plane.

### **Photography (½ Fine Arts Credit) (Grades 10-12) Online HSS0200V**

Emphasis will be on the proper use, care, and function of creating a photograph, lighting techniques, and digital image manipulation. Students can use their own camera equipment, camera phone, or check out a camera from the school.

### **CCE Summer school/CCE work (½ -1 ½ Practical Art Credit, depending on work hours) (Grades 10-12) Online HSS0508V**

Students should be employed in work or internship that directly contributes to the development of the competencies necessary for successful employment in the field they have identified. The student must be concurrently enrolled in the CCE Summer School course to be accepted into the CCE work program. This course is a cooperative effort between the Ozark R-VI school district and area businesses. The student's employer and the course instructor work together to teach the skills and attitude required to be successfully

employed in today's labor market. Students will complete detailed resumes, cover letters and participate in problem-based learning revolving around employment and/or internships.

**Introduction to Business (½ Practical Art Credit) (Grades 9-10) Online HSS0500V**

Do you ever wonder why Ozark doesn't have a Chick-fil-a? Or notice all of the products in your favorite James Bond movie? What about becoming an entrepreneur as famous as Bill Gates or Elon Musk? Would you like to learn to invest in the stock market? Introduction to Business is your chance to explore the many options available to you as you prepare for a career and your financial future.

**Driver's Education (½ General Elective Credit) (Grades 10-12) Online HSS0524V**

This course is designed to help young and future drivers learn the skills, responsibilities, and behaviors required to be safe when operating a motor vehicle. In addition, this course will prepare students for the Missouri instruction permit test. *Students must be 15 to take this course. Driving time will be provided with a course cost of \$100.00 per student.*

**Parenting (½ Credit) (Grades 10-12) Online HSS0530V**

In this Parenting course, you will begin by learning about the roles and responsibilities of parenting. You will spend the remainder of the course learning about the following topics: conception and prenatal development (including birth defects and proper health during pregnancy), newborn development, including care of newborn babies. Time will be spent learning about emotional, social, intellectual (cognitive), and physical development of children age birth to 3 years. There are two optional simulations during this course: empathy belly and baby simulation. The class will require you to take notes for each lesson, watch videos and complete video guides, and complete various daily activities.
